### FUND UPDATE

for the Scheme year ended 30 June 2025

This fund update was first made publicly available on 18 September 2025.

#### What is the purpose of this update?

This document tells you how the Moderate Balanced Fund (**Fund**) has performed and what fees were charged. This document will help you to compare the Fund with other funds. Westpac New Zealand Staff Superannuation Scheme Trustee Limited, the Scheme's trustee, prepared this update in accordance with the Financial Markets Conduct Act 2013. This information is not audited and may be updated.

#### Description of this fund

The Fund invests in assets with a moderate risk of negative returns and with moderate fluctuations in returns over the short term. It is expected to achieve a higher return than the Scheme's Defensive Fund but lower than the Scheme's Growth Fund over the medium to long term.

#### What are the risks of investing?

##### Risk indicator for the Fund



The risk indicator is rated from 1 (low) to 7 (high). The rating reflects how much the value of the Fund's assets goes up and down. A higher risk generally means higher potential returns over time, but more ups and downs along the way.

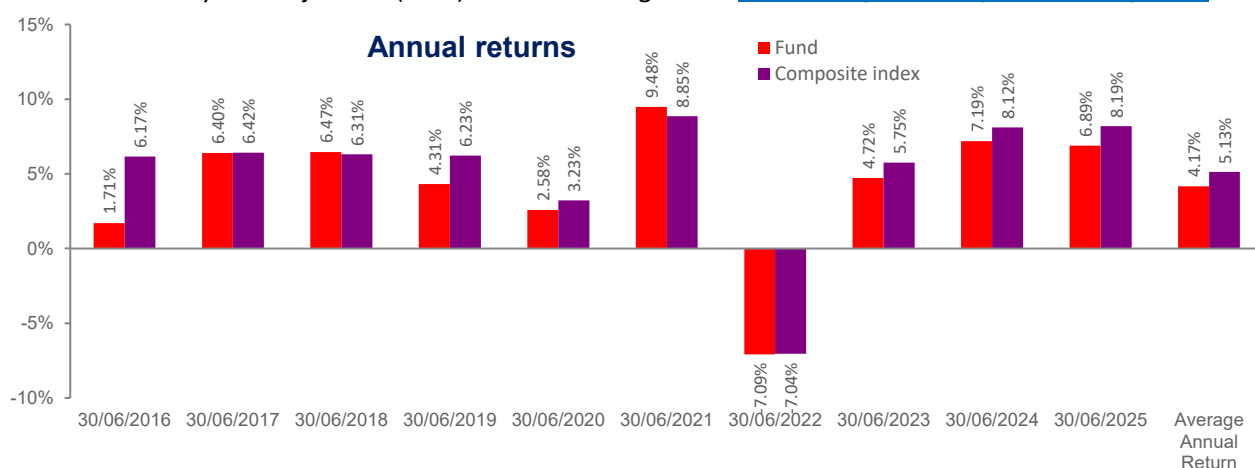
The market index return used from 1 November 2021, and the composite market and peer group index used for the period 1 July 2017 to 31 October 2021, together reflect a composite of benchmark index returns, weighted for the fund's target asset allocation.

Effective from 25 September 2024, there has been a change to the benchmark indices for the international equities and international fixed interest asset classes, which are part of the market index. This change reflects a move to more traditional, broad-based benchmark indices for these asset classes.

Effective 1 April 2025, a component of the return basis for the benchmark indices used in the Australasian equities and real assets asset classes has been updated. The S&P/NZX 50 Gross Index and the S&P/NZX All Real Estate (Industry Group) Gross Index now include imputation credits, aligning with broader industry practice.

The Fund's returns are shown after deductions for fund charges and tax. The composite index returns are a composite of market index returns (before any deductions for fund charges and tax) and peer group index returns (after deductions for fund charges but before tax).

## Example of how this applies to an investor

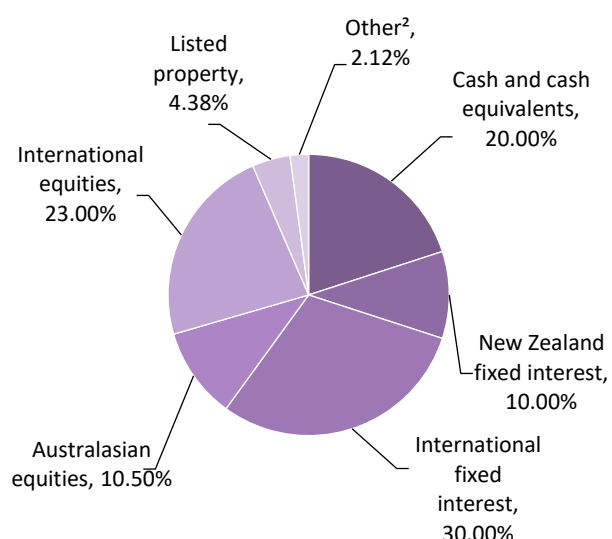
Small differences in fees and charges can have a big impact on your investment over the long term.

Mary had \$10,000 in the Fund at the start of the year and did not make any further contributions. At the end of the year, Mary received a return after fund charges were deducted of \$809 (that is 8.09% of her initial \$10,000). Mary also paid \$0.00 in other charges. This gives Mary a total return after tax of \$689 for the year.

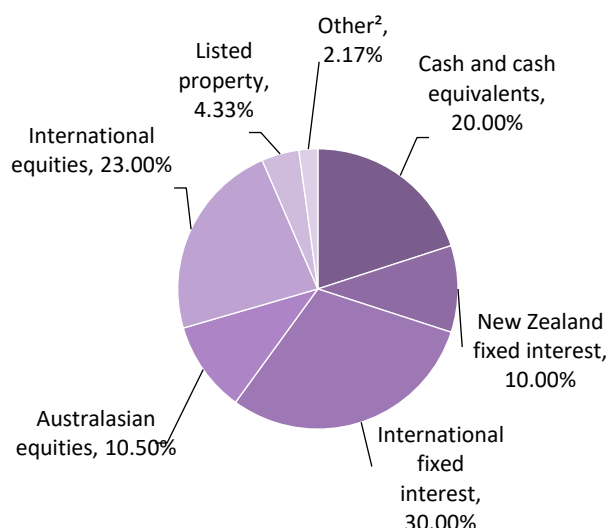
### Actual investment mix at 30 June 2025

## Currency Hedging

Some of the asset classes in the fund have exposure to foreign currencies. As at 30 June 2025, the actual currency hedging is as follows (all % figures below are on a before tax basis):

- International fixed interest – 99% hedged (benchmark 100%)
- Australasian equities – 67% hedged (benchmark 70%)
- International equities – 56% hedged (benchmark 60%)
- Listed property (Australasian) – 101% hedged (benchmark 100%)
- Listed property (International) – 138% hedged (benchmark 139%)
- Listed infrastructure – 101% hedged (benchmark 100%)

The return for the peer group index used in the composite index and reflected in the table and bar graph is net of fund charges and trading expenses (if any) but before tax.
